tree—how deep to plant it, how to fill the hole back in, how to stake and mulch it, and most importantly, how to take care of it in the future.

Some of the Boy Scouts were having so much fun that they pretended they were trees and planted themselves inside the metal cages.

Roberson, "This was a great project for our park and the trees are beautiful." She and her husband will be maintaining the trees and making sure they have plenty of water in the summer.

Some of the trees that were planted will be used as memorial trees to remember family members and friends from the Ruddle community.
